


YOU COULD WIN



'The Eyes That Shine: From Ireland to Canada,' written by Philip Donnelly, is the story of his life and his marriage to his beloved Nancy, now deceased.

The novel covers the lives of the Donnelly families, and some of their neighbours, who lived more than 100 years ago near Ballyleborough in rural Ireland. It takes in the history of Donnellys in Ulster, and of the Milner family (the author's in-laws) in Dublin and County Cork. There are recollections about people, places and events from the author's days as a professional engineer and senior public servant with the Canadian government during the terms of prime ministers John Diefenbaker to Brian Mulroney. The novel features 300 pages, many old photographs, maps, and a full index of key people, places, and topics.

Ireland's former ambassador to Canada, His Excellency Declan Kelly, said, "Philip Donnelly tells the story of one of the many Irish families who, over the years, came to Canada to start a new life and, through their hard work and determination, achieved great success in their adopted home. It is important that stories like this are not forgotten."
